


Figure 1: Registration Detail

**Session 1: Dr. Ajit Singh** (CEO and Co-Founder Climed Research Solution, ICMR Research Associate-III, Manipal)

Technical session started with talk of Dr. Ajir singh on topic entitled Clinical research in PCOS at glance. Dr. Singh mentioned that research suggests that 5% to 10% of females 18 to 44 years of age are affected by PCOS, making it the most common endocrine abnormality among women of reproductive age in the U.S. Dr. Singh emphasized that women with PCOS have higher rates of endometrial cancer, cardiovascular disease, dyslipidemia, and type-2 diabetes mellitus. Dr. Singh had summarized completed and ongoing clinical trials in PCOS within india as well as across the countries for better understanding about research spectrum. Dr. Singh had also shared possible scope of research in clinical research on PCOS in future. The session one was completed with question and answer from participants.

Session 2: Dr. HardikSoni (AGM, Vasu Research Center, Vadodara)

Dr Hardik Soni delivered his talk on "Herbal drug research in PCOS". Dr. Soni explained the brief process about innovation. Dr Soni explained Cimicifuga racemosa, Cinnamomum cassia, Curcuma longa, Glycyrrhiza spp., Matricaria chamomilla, Mentha piperita, Paeonia lactiflora, Silybum marianum, Tribulus terrestris and Vitex agnus-castus demonstrated mechanism of reproductive endocrinological effect for the whole herbal extract in PCOS. Dr Soni also explained that herbal medicine may present a treatment option for women with oligo/amenorrhoea, hyperandrogenism and PCOS as an adjunct or alternative treatment to pharmaceuticals with a high degree of acceptability by women with PCOS. Dr Soni also shared importance of safety and efficacy of herbal formulations in PCOS are not sufficient and further studies are required to establish a therapeutic intervention.

### **Session 3: Dr. Chirag Patel**(Assistant Professor, LMCP, Ahmedabad)

Dr. Patel shared his expertise of preclinical research in PCOS. Dr Patel explained that pathogenesis and treatment of PCOS are still unclear. He summarized various animal PCOS models that uses indirect hormonal interventions and suggested or discussed pathogenesis of PCOS-like features in animals. Dr. Patel explained that hormonal and metabolic changes could be due to molecular dysregulations, such as upregulated PI3K-Akt and extracellular signal-regulated kinase (ERK) signalling, that potentially cause PCOS-like phenotypes in the animal models.Dr. Patel explained HPG axis correlation in establishing PCOS models.



#### **Session 4:Dr. Shivani Desai**(Manager, Serum Institute of India, Pune)

Dr. Shivani delivered seminar on PCOS and Diabetes mellitus. She explained regular physical activity, maintaining appropriate body weight, following healthy dietary patterns and avoiding tobacco use is vital in prevention and treatment of metabolic disorders, and is included in clinical guidelines for various conditions. Dr Shivani Suggested that reduction in the caloric content of the diet. She shared ketogenic diet (KD) improves the menstrual cycle, reducing blood glucose and body weight, improving liver function, and treating fatty liver in women with PCOS and liver dysfunction who were obese. Physical training potentiates the effects caused by insulin sensitivity through the optimization of glucose transport and metabolism.



Dr. Jaspret shared some vital symptomatic complications and issues associated with PCOS. She shared some case studies associated with PCOS required integrated treatment approach. Clinical problems like Acne, Hirsutism and many other skin based problems were explained with case studies and also explained how they can be managed with integrated treatment by expert cosmetologist. She shared that each patients of PCOS exhibited different symptoms and its intensity at different stages. She explained some of the management options and emphasized on PRP therapy. 

Session 6: Dr. Bhavin Vyas (Associate Professor, Maliba Pharmacy College, Bardoli)

Dr. Vyas shared his valuable knowledge on the advances and challenges in PCOS research. He explained that PCOS clinical features are heterogeneous, with manifestations arising even in early adolescence, developing into multisystem reproductive, metabolic and psychological manifestations in adulthood. He also shared latest ongoing research trials and preclinical studies on PCOS. Role of proteomic and bioinformatics in genetic level studies of PCOS was also discussed. Repurposing of medicines in PCOS research and their updated results from journals are also summarized and extracted. He covered the topics from Preclinical, Clinical challenges and advances in PCOS research and tried to justify to the title of his talk.


