

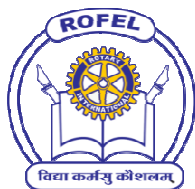

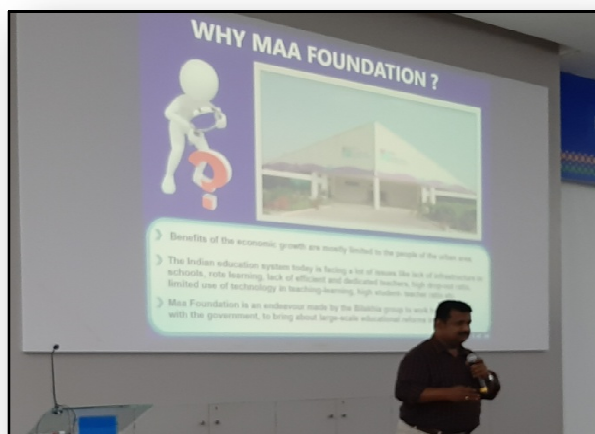
A total of **72 students** from **B. Pharm Sem – I** (class strength – 73), participated in the seminar.
