Summary:

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of *ROFEL Shri G.M. Bilakhia College of Pharmacy* a constituent college of Rajju Shroff ROFEL University organized a Two-Day Induction Programme for the newly admitted B. Pharm, D. Pharm, and M. Pharm students on 13th and 14th October at the Rotary Balar Auditorium, ROFEL Campus, Vapi.

The programme was conducted with the objective of welcoming new students into the academic fraternity, orienting them to the ethos, rules, and academic culture of the institution, and equipping them with skills and motivation essential for their professional journey in the pharmaceutical domain. DAY 1 SESSION OVERVIEW:

Registration and Reporting
